### Additional Information about Program

Our internship at BluePearl Veterinary Partners New York is an outstanding learning experience for those interested in pursuing a residency, full-time emergency work, or progressive general practice. We are proud of our supportive work environment, and encourage applications from strongly motivated individuals, with good academic records and great personal skills. The successful candidate will possess qualities including excellent communication skills, willingness to learn, and the ability to work well with a team.

Interviews are required, but are by invitation only, after review of a completed application. Applicants will be contacted via e-mail to set an appointment date/time.

BluePearl Veterinary Partners NYC is a group of 4 busy referral and emergency practices in New York City. We look forward to welcoming our 13th intern class in June 2018. It is worth noting that all 4 of our NYC hospitals are full service, 24/7 facilities. None are considered "secondary or satellite". All 4 hospitals provide full-time Internal Medicine, Surgery, Emergency Medicine, and Critical Care. Other specialty services are provided several days each week at all hospitals: Anesthesiology, Cardiology, Dermatology, Neurology, Oncology, Ophthalmology and Radiology. Our Midtown hospital, where interns spend the most time, is 20,000 square-feet, and state of the art in design and equipment. In addition, we have full service hospitals in Brooklyn (Boerum Hill), Downtown Manhattan, and Queens (Forest Hills) that are fully integrated in the NYC group. Rotations among our four NYC hospitals ensure that our interns are trained with exposure to a broad array of experiences.

Interns rotate through Internal Medicine, Critical Care, Neurology, Surgery, and Emergency Medicine in 2-3 week rotations in the Brooklyn, Downtown, Manhattan, and Queens hospitals. Elective rotations are offered in Anesthesiology, Cardiology, Dermatology, Oncology, Ophthalmology, and Radiology. Our interns will not have rotations in the new BluePearl hospital in Paramus, NJ. Special consideration will be given to requests for an elective of special interest provided outside the nationwide BluePearl group.

Our diagnostic and treatment capabilities are extensive. Our four hospitals contain 30 examination rooms, 7 surgery suites, separate ICUs, 5 digital radiology suites, fluoroscopy, interventional radiology (tracheal and urinary stenting), separate ultrasound rooms, one MRI and three CT units, linear accelerator radiotherapy, hemodialysis, and a radio-iodine treatment and housing facility.

Education opportunities include weekly didactic lectures for interns, weekly journal club, specialty service rounds, Grand Rounds, Morbidity and Mortality Rounds, monthly continuing education for the regional veterinary community, including lectures by our senior clinicians and lectures for the New York City veterinary association. Free online access to most veterinary journals is provided.

Intern benefits include a \$500 stipend, uniform allowance, 10 days paid time off (PTO) including sick days, professional liability insurance (PLIT) including license defense protection (AVMA membership required), VIN membership; and BluePearl health, dental and eye insurance plans. New York City and State VMA/VMS membership is provided.
