

Hello veterinary student,

This letter is an invitation to visit our practice and consider applying for our internship program, which starts in June 2018. We are a multi-specialty, general practice, and emergency veterinary hospital located in Walnut Creek, CA, and an emergency-only hospital in Antioch, CA.

About Us:

- Our hospital has 2 internists, 1 oncologist, 2 dentists, 1 neurologist, 2 surgeons, 1 criticalist, 4 emergency doctors, 15 RVTs, and 1 VTS (anesthesia).
- Diagnostic/treatment capabilities: Abdominal ultrasound, color flow/spectral Doppler echocardiography, in-house lab analyzers (blood gases, PT/PTT, chemistry, CBC), electrocardiography, blood pressure, video endoscopy, digital radiography, laparoscopy/thoracoscopy, ventilators, and computed tomography. We outsource our MRIs to a local MRI center.

About the Program:

- Internship program was established in 2004
- There are 6-7 interns per class
- Our internship consists of thirteen 4-week rotations. The first month is for orientation and the following months are spent in internal medicine, surgery, dentistry, general practice, oncology, neurology, anesthesia, and emergency medicine.
- Interns have a lot of primary case responsibility with support by senior clinicians 24/7.
- Interns are given the opportunity to perform abdominal ultrasounds and echocardiograms with mentorship on a regular basis. We feel these are invaluable skills to learn and give our interns the opportunity to do so.
- We have an intern surgery program, which allows clients with financial constraints to pursue surgery for their pet, and for the interns to do these surgeries with supervision from a veterinary mentor. Examples of intern surgeries are the following: splenectomy, gastrotomy, enterotomy, cystotomy, gastropexy, amputation, enucleation, mass removal, c-section and pyometra. The interns each perform 7-15 surgeries during the year. They also perform spays and neuters during a rotation at a local animal shelter and other minor procedures and surgeries while working with our general practitioners and specialists.
- Benefits include medical insurance, dental insurance, vision care plan, HSA option, 401(k), discounted veterinary services and products.

This is a great opportunity for veterinarians who want an internship with primary care responsibility and the ability to learn ultrasonography, echocardiography and surgery. "I was in intern 2010-2011 from the University of Florida. I interviewed at all five northern California programs and a few in Colorado. I chose Encina for a number of reasons. First, the surgery experience was far and away the best. I came out having done at least 70 spays/neuters, and more importantly, had performed all of the major surgeries – gastrotomy/enterotomy, GDV, splenectomies, enucleations, amputations, and even c-sections.

Second, I got great ultrasound/echocardiogram experience. Unfortunately, the machine you get spoiled with at Encina is nowhere to be found in the real world, but it was a great start. I feel confident in identifying all of the major abnormalities, and I've even been able to pick up some of the more subtle lesions. It's all because I had significant time with the ultrasound and numerous cases. I feel quite confident in doing an echo when I get the opportunity.

Lastly, I simply learned a lot. It's the most diverse specialist-wise, and having all of those resources was one of the biggest draws. The setup for the satellite ER hospital is perfect. There's always someone awake at the main hospital to go over cases which is the way it should be. You have the autonomy to manage your cases, and help is a phone call away. It was a great confidence booster and made the learning quicker than would be in another situation. The docs there are genuinely interested in teaching.

There are long days like any internship. I felt worn out from time to time. Most importantly, I enjoyed coming to the clinic every day because I was able to practice the way I wanted to practice, I was in a place where they were interested in making me better, and it was the perfect start to the best career in the world.

To any future intern, I highly recommend EBVSE/EVH. I would not hesitate to do it again. I do recommend you visit any practice you are considering applying to. It's well worth your time because it's one of the most important years of your career."
