VET PREP PROGRAM

WHAT WILL I LEARN AND EXPERIENCE IN MY STUDIES?

Courses in the VetPrep program include science, mathematics, and scientific writing. Case-based learning is a separate course, though its principles are used throughout the VetPrep program. Additionally, students can benefit from a transitional course that introduces them to their academic veterinary medicine program and promotes mindfulness and study skills.

Students who successfully complete the VetPrep program will be placed into first semester classes. The Admissions Committee decides who is accepted into this program.

WHAT SERVICES WILL I RECEIVE?

Services available to all students include:

- A New Student Coordinator to answer questions, review necessary visa materials, liaise with student housing as needed, and provide general support to incoming students.
- Health and wellness services available through the Student Health Services Office and Counseling Center.
- Academic support through the Student Success Center, including individual study strategy appointments, interactive study skills workshops, academic coaching, teaching assistants, and a tutor program.

PROGRAM COSTS AND FINANCING OPTIONS

Tuition for the VetPrep program is \$18,310. Other required costs include health insurance, housing and association fees.

Financial aid is not available for the VetPrep program, with the following payment options available:

- Full payment at time of enrollment
- Private loan through bank
- Installment payment plan

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

The percentage of students starting the prep program in fiscal year 2015-16 who successfully completed it is 96%.
