### PROGRAM BENEFITS

Students who have completed their undergraduate junior year at University of Maryland Eastern Shore and have met the academic criteria established by University of Maryland Eastern Shore and the Ross Vet Pathways Program will receive these Ross Vet benefits:

- An application fee waiver (except where prohibited by law)
- Priority application consideration
- A guaranteed admissions interview
- Access to a designated seat in one of our three semester starts: January, May, or September

from University of Maryland Eastern Shore within past year

#### Overall GPA of 3.0

or higher

OPTIONAL

#### GRE® 20th Percentile

or better in each category (highly recommended)

#### GPA of 3.0

or higher in all Ross Vet prerequisite courses



## HBCU ARTICULATION PARTNER SCHOLARSHIP

University of Maryland Eastern Shore students will also be considered for the Ross Vet Articulation Partner Scholarship for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU).<sup>1</sup> This scholarship is offered to students who have graduated, or are in the process of graduating, from a signed articulation agreement partner that is recognized as an HBCU.

- The value of the scholarship is equal to the cost of one semester of tuition, which is currently \$24,525 USD.
- Students will also be eligible for a \$1,000 USD tuition deposit credit,<sup>2</sup> a housing grant for options in the Ross Vet housing department database (up to a \$4,235 USD value<sup>2</sup>) for one semester of enrollment, and a \$1,000 USD flight credit for their flight to St. Kitts.<sup>2</sup>

- General Biology I & II With Lab
- General Chemistry I With Lab
- Organic Chemistry I With Lab
- Cell Biology or Genetics
- Physics I With Lab
- Pre-Calculus, Calculus, or Statistics
- One Semester of General Biochemistry or Biochemistry 1

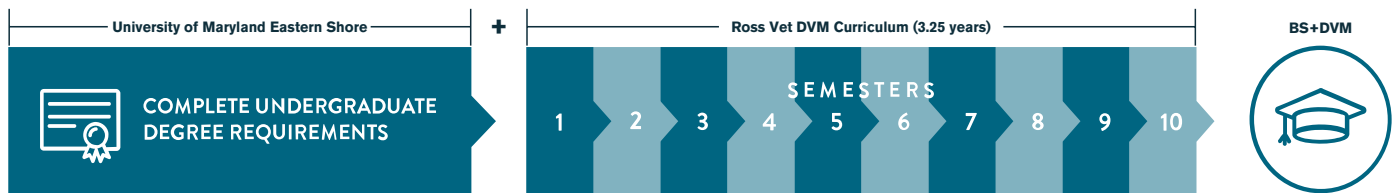
Note: Introductory or survey courses are not acceptable.

- Expository Writing or Another Writing Intensive or English Course

- Medical Terminology
- Microbiology

- Public Speaking
- Introduction to Business

Dual degree programs that give students the opportunity to complete a master's degree alongside their Doctor of Veterinary Medicine

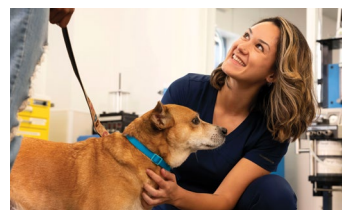
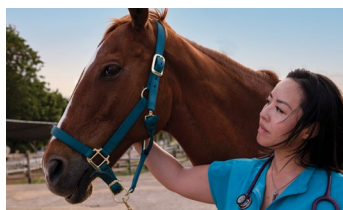
