

PROGRAM BENEFITS

Students who have completed their undergraduate junior year and have met the academic criteria established through our Pathways Program will receive these benefits:

- \$1,000 tuition deposit fee waived (as applicable)
- \$100 application fee waived (except where prohibited by law)
- Priority application consideration
- Personal admissions interview
- Designated seats for eligible students in each of our three semester starts: January, May, and September
- Scholarships dedicated to graduates of HSIs

ALIGNED COURSEWORK

Our HSI Pathways Program defines an aligned list of undergraduate coursework that meets these Ross Vet admissions prerequisites.



Completion of the following coursework:

- Two semesters of Biology (eight semester hours) with laboratory
- One course of either Cell Biology or Genetics (three semester hours); laboratory is recommended but not required
- One semester of General Chemistry (four semester hours) with laboratory
- One semester of Organic Chemistry (four semester hours) with laboratory
- One semester Biochemistry (three semester hours)
- One semester of Physics (four semester hours) with laboratory
- One course of mathematics (three semester hours) to be chosen among pre-calculus, calculus, and statistics
- One semester of English (at least three semester hours), preferably to include one semester of English Composition for US students
- Canadian Students may satisfy English requirements in 4 possible ways: (1) 2 semesters of University humanities where essays composed at least 40% of the overall mark, (2) those holding a grade 13 English credit in Ontario, (3) International Baccalaureate and (4) Advanced Placement English

Nine semester hours; one of the courses to meet this requirement must be one of the following:

- Comparative Anatomy, Medical Terminology, Microbiology, Nutrition, Physiology, Spanish (or other foreign language), Public Speaking, Introduction to Business
