

Ross University School of Veterinary Medicine's (Ross Vet) AVMA-accredited¹ DVM program is located on the culturally distinct island of St. Kitts and provides up close and personal interactions with domestic, native terrestrial, and aquatic animals, as well as opportunities for agricultural, wildlife, and ecosystem connections.

PRECLINICAL CURRICULUM

Ross Vet introduces key concepts and skills as early as the first semester that repeat throughout the preclinical curriculum with increased complexity and through a variety of applications. From day one, our students learn and develop communication and clinical skills through case-based, situational experiences, strengthening core competencies and equipping them to transition to their clinical year. The use of models in early semesters allows our students to practice both in labs and at home. Our faculty and instructors provide continuous feedback, helping students work towards proficiency and improve confidence.

ANATOMY LAB


Understand the anatomical structures and functions of both small and large animals.


CLINICAL YEAR

The clinical year is when students begin to transition from student to doctor. After seven semesters of studying abroad in St. Kitts, students spend their final three semesters at one of Ross Vet's AVMA-accredited affiliate partner schools in the U.S., Canada, Europe, or New Zealand. During their clinical year, students work alongside licensed clinicians where they examine, diagnose, and treat real patients in need of care. It's an opportunity to apply their knowledge and further develop their skills to be practice-ready. Clinical students complete an intensive 45-week clinical experience inclusive of 20-weeks of core clinical experience and 25 weeks of electives, externships, and any additional requirements of their clinical site. Each clinical rotation varies in length, providing students with hands-on experience and opportunities to develop mastery of skills in multiple disciplines of veterinary medicine.



ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS.

We take a holistic view of the vet school admissions process. From undergraduate courses to field experience, academic transcripts to the personal essay, every piece of the application helps the admissions committee identify those who will thrive in our challenging and life-changing program.

Students may apply with up to two pending courses. We prefer grades of C or better in all prerequisite coursework and coursework cannot be more than 10 years old.



ROSS VET ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

48+ Credits of College Work

- Two semesters of General Biology (eight semester hours) with laboratory.
- One course (three semester hours); Lab is recommended but not required
- One semester of General Chemistry (four semester hours) with laboratory.
- One semester of Organic Chemistry 1 (four semester hours) with laboratory.
- One semester of General Biochemistry or Biochemistry 1 (three semester hours).
 - Note: Introductory or survey courses are not acceptable.
 - One semester of Physics 1 (four semester hours) with laboratory.
 - Note: Introductory or survey courses are not acceptable.
- One semester of college-level mathematics (three semester hours) to be chosen among pre-calculus, calculus, and statistics.

- One semester of English (at least three semester hours), preferably to include one semester of English Composition. Canadian students may satisfy English requirements in 3 possible ways: (1) 2 semesters of University humanities where essays composed at least 40% of the overall mark, (2) International Baccalaureate, and (3) Advanced Placement English.
- Nine semester hours; one of the courses to meet this requirement must be one of the following:
 - Comparative Anatomy
 - Medical Terminology
 - Microbiology
 - Nutrition
 - Physiology
- Spanish (or other foreign language)
 - Public Speaking
 - Introduction to business

APPLYING AT ROSS VET.

Ross Vet is the only AVMA-accredited DVM program¹ with three start dates. We provide students with practical experiences and opportunities to dive deep into veterinary medicine, gain new skills, work with real patients, and build something more than just a resume.

JANUARY

Start at Ross Vet in January and you may complete your DVM at the same time as students who begin in the previous September semester at a U.S. school*

MAY

Starting in May allows you to finish 9 months earlier than waiting and starting in the following September semester at a U.S. school*

SEPTEMBER

Start in our fall session and you may finish 4 months sooner than starting at the same time as other AVMA-accredited programs in the U.S.*

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students may apply through Ross Vet's online application or through the Veterinary Medical College Application Service (VMCAS), the Association of American Veterinary Medical Colleges application service—we accept either. Ross Vet offers three admissions outcomes for students: accept, deny, or Vet Prep.

VET PREP

Ross Vet offers a 14-week bridge program for aspiring veterinary medical students who may not meet some of our academic requirements. Vet Prep teaches foundational knowledge, skills, and terminology, setting students up for success once they enter the DVM program. Prospective students cannot apply directly to the Vet Prep program. The Admissions Committee decides on who is accepted into this program based upon the academic requirements of the DVM program. Students who are offered Vet Prep and pass are guaranteed a spot in the next first-semester class.

DUAL DEGREE

Ross Vet is committed to research, benefiting from a high-quality research environment provided by our four Research Centers. Our Dual Degree DVM and Masters by Research offers students the opportunity to pursue a research interest through either an integrated or intercalated program approach. Research areas emphasize emerging infectious and zoonotic diseases, conservation medicine, and ecosystem health.

APPLYING AT ROSS VET.

We recognize that Ross Vet is a great place and offers a tuition rate that is mid-range among U.S. private and out-of-state public veterinary school tuition rates. Our students typically finance the cost of their veterinary school education by combining family resources, student loans from governmental and other agencies, and private sources.



* Students must successfully pass all courses prescribed in the Ross Vet preclinical and clinical curriculum without failing or repeating any courses, and pass the North American Veterinary Licensing Examination (NAVLE) to complete their degree within this time frame. Comparison to U.S. School is based on a traditional 4-year curriculum.

Ross Vet partners with colleges and universities to ensure that we create a pathway for eligible students to move seamlessly from undergraduate studies to veterinary school. We partner closely with you to develop an articulation agreement tailored to your school's program needs and requirements, creating opportunities for students to pursue their passion and earn a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree.

We offer a variety of benefits to partner schools that establish an articulation agreement with Ross Vet. Students who have completed their undergraduate junior year and have met the academic criteria established through our Pathways Program may receive benefits such as:

- \$1,000 tuition deposit fee waived (as applicable)
- \$100 application fee waived (except where prohibited by law)
- Priority application consideration
- Personal admissions interview
- Designated seats for eligible students in each of our three-semester starts: January, May, and September
