PROGRAM BENEFITS

McGill University students who are enrolled in the BSc (AgEnvSc) Life Sciences Major may apply to transfer to Ross University School of Veterinary Medicine (Ross Vet) in St. Kitts to complete the DVM program. Once students have met the academic criteria established through the McGill University and Ross Vet Pathways Program, they will receive these benefits:

- Ross Vet application fee waived (except where prohibited by law)
- Priority application consideration at Ross Vet
- Guaranteed admissions interview with Ross Vet
- Ross Vet will designate seats for eligible students in each of our three semesters: January, May, and September

VETERINARY SCHOLARSHIPS

Qualifying McGill students will also be considered for the following scholarships:*

McGill-Ross Vet Scholarship

 \$2,000 USD per semester for the first three semesters; lifetime cap of \$6,000 USD.

Global Experience Scholarship

 \$45,000 USD distributed in equal installments of \$6,428.57 USD per semester between semesters 4-10 of the DVM program. Only available to students starting in the January or May semesters.

Ross Vet coursework prerequisites for DVM program admissions

Completion of the following courses:

- General Biology I & II with Lab
- General Chemistry I with Lab
- Organic Chemistry I with Lab
- Cell Biology or Genetics
- Physics I with Lab
- Pre-Calculus, Calculus, or Statistics
- One semester of General Biochemistry or Biochemistry 1 (three semester hours).

Note: Introductory or survey courses are not acceptable

Expository Writing or another Writing Intensive or English Course

Nine semester hours of electives; must include one of the following courses:

- Comparative Anatomy
- Medical Terminology
- Psychology
- Microbiology
- **Animal Nutrition**
- Physiology
- Spanish (or other foreign language)
